- Promote fellowship, goodwill, understanding and harmony among descendants of Fukushima Prefecture, Japan.


Fukushima North America Youth Homestay Program

The Fukushima Prefecture Government selected five Fukushima immigrated descendants to North America, 15-39 yrs. of age, to participate in a 9 day program, July 1, to July 9, 2015. Participants had experienced:

- *Tokyo Tour & the Yokohama Migration Museum
- *Local cuisine at a Japanese hot spring inn (Onsen)
- *Home stay or visit at Fukushima relatives' homes to learn their "roots"
- *Investigating the history of emigration.
- *Earthquake, tsunami, & nuclear plant devastation recovery efforts.
- *Fukushima University citizen exchange program.
- *Visit Aizu & Iwaki areas castles and sea life.

All expenses incurred in Japan in conjunction with the program's implementation (such as accommodations, some meals, & travel expenses) were covered by the Fukushima Prefecture or cooperating organizations. All other expenses including air fare from Narita Airport, were the responsibility of the participants, with assistance from our HFKK Educational Grant.

We believe this program has provided a wonderful opportunity for our young family members with Fukushima ancestors to trace their roots and experience Japan in a personalized way. It nurtures them with future bridges between Fukushima and Hawaii.


